#### Headteacher's Message

Last night we sent home a letter from Public Health England regarding travel and the Coronavirus. Today, I wanted to give you information regarding school specifically.

Public Health England state hygiene as being of the upmost importance at this time and we need to reinforce this message in school. This was done in assembly on Wednesday in a way that the children could access and remember easily without worrying them about the virus specifically. Miss Jackson talked to the children about washing hands effectively with soap and warm water for the duration of the song 'happy birthday.' When coughing or sneezing it is suggested that this is straight into a tissue before binning and then washing hands or coughing into the crook of your arm. By using these same strategies at home it will not only remind the children to wash their hands properly but also minimise risk.

Please be reassured that Public Health England and the DfE are giving schools advice to follow regarding this virus. We will of course keep you informed by the mobile app or newsletter, as appropriate.

# Are you interested in losing weight and improving the health of your family?
