

Free digital book - Coronavirus

Many parents and carers are struggling to explain the current extraordinary situation to children. This book answers key questions in simple language appropriate for 5 to 9 year olds. It is free for anyone to read on screen or print out, about the coronavirus and the measures taken to control it.

Professor Graham Medley of the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine acted as a consultant, and the company also had advice from two head teachers and a child psychologist.
