P.E. School Meal—Price increase The cost of a school dinner will increase from 1st April 2023 to £2.40. (£12 p.w.). The new price will be reflected on ParentPay. We have staggered the price increase over this academic year to reduce the financial impact on our families, whilst also trying to minimize the impact on the school budget. Please remember that a half terms notice is required if you wish to change from a packed lunch to a school meal or vice versa.
